

Drought-ridden West Africa has seen a dramatic shift in the number of people affected by the Ebola outbreak, with the number of new cases jumping from 170 in October to 4,210 now. Many of the new cases are in Nigeria, according to a report by the WHO. Nigeria has one of the highest numbers of Ebola cases in the world, with the outbreak accelerating rapidly in recent months as officials failed to take action in the early stages of the outbreak. "We are concerned about the recent increase in the number of cases in Nigeria. We call on the Nigerian authorities to enhance efforts to contain this outbreak, including deploying all necessary resources at the source," said Peter Salama, director of the World Health Organization's emergencies program. The WHO says the increase in new Ebola cases since the start of the year is "particularly concerning," as the country experienced a drop in new cases in October. In the last 24 hours, the WHO says, at least 100 new confirmed cases and 13 new deaths were reported in the country. The Nigerian government confirmed 54 new cases, most of which occurred in three western states. Nigeria's foreign ministry says all but one of the patients have survived. But there have been about 2,400 suspected cases and about 1,400 deaths. Experts say the country is not doing enough to contain the outbreak. "Nigeria is not doing enough to contain this outbreak," Emi, a medical doctor with the NGO Global Fund for Women, told CBN News. "The country has been hit very badly by Boko Haram. That has led to the shortage of funds and resources. And as a result, the health workers are not being trained and sent into the field to reach out to all the patients." The WHO says the number of new cases is just the tip of the iceberg. "Nigeria is likely to see more cases in the next few weeks as they travel between states," said Dr. Peter Salama, WHO's Director for Emergency Programs. "There are a lot of cases where the person did not seek treatment and the disease went undetected." More than 1,000 people who were evacuated from the current outbreak have returned to Sierra Leone and Liberia. The WHO estimates that the number of people exposed to Ebola in West Africa could rise to more than 10,000 people if the Ebola outbreak continues. 82157476af
